

PRIMARY ELECTION PROCLAMATION

ALBANY COUNTY, WYOMING
TUESDAY, AUGUST 16, 2022 – PRIMARY ELECTION DAY

LAST DAY TO REGISTER TO VOTE: Monday, August 1, 2022. A person may register at an absentee polling place after the statutory close of registration, as provided in W.S. 22-3-102, upon doing so they must also cast their absentee ballot according to the provisions of W.S. 22-3-117(a). Registration **is** permitted at the polls on Primary Election Day.

ABSENTEE VOTING: Any qualified elector may vote by absentee ballot. A qualified elector who leaves the state with the intent to make his residence elsewhere may vote by absentee ballot in Wyoming until he has met the residency requirement in his new state of residence.

A qualified elector may apply for an absentee ballot at anytime during the calendar year in which the election is held, but not on the day of the election. A qualified elector may apply for an absentee ballot either in person, in writing, (Albany County Clerk, Courthouse, Suite 202, Laramie, Wyoming 82070) or by telephone (307-721-2546). Absentee voting at the County Clerk’s office will begin on Friday, July 1, 2022.

All qualified electors wishing to vote in person by absentee may vote in the Election Building located on the east side of the Albany County Courthouse. This absentee polling site will be open Monday-Friday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. July 1, 2022, to August 15, 2022, for the Primary Election and September 23, 2022, to November 7, 2022, for the General Election. Please keep in mind that the absentee polling site is not open on Election Day. You must vote at your designated polling place on Election Day.

VOTING ASSISTANCE: Not more than one (1) person may occupy a voting booth at any time, except that any elector who requires assistance to vote because of blindness, disability, or inability to read or write may be given assistance by a person of the elector’s choice, other than the elector’s employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of the elector’s union.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT A:

The Wyoming Constitution allows the state to invest state funds in equities such as the stock of corporations, but does not allow the funds of counties, cities, and other political subdivisions to be invested in equities. The adoption of this amendment would allow the funds of counties, cities, and other political subdivisions to be invested in equities to the extent and in the manner the legislature may allow by law. Any law authorizing the investment of specified political subdivision funds in equities would require a two-thirds vote of both houses of the legislature.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT B:

Currently, the Wyoming Constitution requires Wyoming Supreme Court justices and district court judges to retire upon reaching the age of seventy (70). This amendment increases the mandatory retirement age of Supreme Court justices and district court judges from age seventy (70) to age seventy-five (75).

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS, INITIATIVES, REFERENDUMS, AND BALLOT PROPOSITIONS:

Any additional amendments, initiatives, referendums, or ballot propositions filed later will be published in the General Election Proclamation.

CAMPAIGN REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:

Wyoming statutes on campaign finance apply to candidates, candidate campaign committees, and PACs supporting candidates for Governor, Secretary of State, State Auditor, State Treasurer, State Superintendent of Public Instruction, State Legislature, County Offices, School Boards and Community College Boards of Trustees, and Municipal Offices.

In an election year, candidates, candidate campaign committees, and PACs are required to file a report before each election. A contributions and expenditures report is due between seven (7) and fourteen (14) days before each election (Primary, General, & Special). If there are additional contributions and expenditures after a report has been filed, an amendment to the report must be filed. Amendments to filed reports must be made within 30 days from the time an error or additional contributions and expenditures become known. Net changes amounting to less than \$200 do not need to be reported.

Ongoing candidate committees and PACs are required to file an annual report by December 31st in odd-numbered years (non-election years) reporting their contributions and expenditures for the odd-year. If a committee is supporting a candidate who is not running for election that year, the committee must still file the Primary and General reports.

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
